Whereas: William Edward Burghardt Du Bois - Civil Rights Activist, Leader, Sociologist, Educator, Historian, Writer, Editor, Poet, Scholar, and Socialist, Considered by many the greatest Black Thinker of the Twentieth Century Born, February 23, 1868 – Died, August 27, 1963)

Whereas: When he could have successfully passed over to the larger Society he made a conscious unbreakable commitment to his race, in writing "The Souls of Black Folk". He also instigated the Co-Founding of the Niagra Movement as well as the NAACP

Whereas: In the course of his long, turbulent career, his restless mind kept him seeking for different ways to the solve problems of Twentieth Century Racism - Scholarship, Integration, Propaganda, Cultural and Economic Separatism, Politics, International Communism, Third World Solidarity, and Expatriation

Whereas: His writings, activities, and accomplishments are to numerous to mention, and he and his wife lived for many years at both the "Dunbar Apartment Complex" & 409 Edgecombe Avenue.

Whereas: *His intellect was powerfully balanced and his Societal Analysis very deep. His involvement was nonetheless a key and vital factor in directing towards excellence all those with whom he worked and indeed his Race, excellence being in his analysis a major part of the solution to racism in our time.*

Whereas: During the **March on Washington**, when word came to all the great Civil Rights Leaders that he was gone - they knew & agreed that their Father had passed
